Burghound Score: 85-88	<p>An ebulliently fresh red berry fruit nose is liberally laced with earth nuances which continue onto the attractively vibrant and well-detailed flavors that are delicious, all wrapped in a compact, short and mildly strict finish. I suspect that this will progressively unwind and become more inviting with a few years of bottle age.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 85-87	<p>The 2017 Bourgogne Rouge has quite a generous raspberry preserve and strawberry scented bouquet. The palate has light dark plummy fruit, a crisp line of acidity with just a dab of spice towards the finish. Enjoy over the next three or four years.</p> <p><i>Neal Martin</i></p>

Burghound Score: 87-89	<p>A more deeply pitched nose reflects aromas of humus-inflected red and dark currant that display hints of earth and leather. The supple yet reasonably well-detailed medium weight flavors possess a lovely mouthfeel before concluding in a youthfully austere finish where a touch of wood arises.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 89-91	<p>The 2017 Gevrey-Chambertin, which matures in 40% new oak, has a lovely red cherry and wild strawberry bouquet that feels delicate and pure. The palate is very well balanced with a fine acidity, lightly spiced with a dash of white pepper towards the finish. It has a directness that is pleasing, a no-frills but quite delicious Village Cru in the making. Excellent.</p> <p><i>Neal Martin</i></p>

Burghound Score: 88-91	<p>There is just enough reduction present to push the underlying fruit to the background. Otherwise there is good volume to the lightly mineral-inflected middle weight flavors that possess a notably finer mouthfeel thanks to the relatively fine-grained tannins shaping the softly austere but persistent finish. This is sufficiently inviting that it could be enjoyed on the younger side.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 89-91	<p>The 2017 Gevrey-Chambertin 1er Cru, the usual blend from La Perrière and Crapaillot, has a floral, elegant and effervescent bouquet bursting with Morello cherries, crushed strawberry and flinty scents. The palate is supple but with good body, quite harmonious with a fine bead of acidity, perhaps just pulling up a little short on the finish. Burghound Score: 90-92	<p>Earth, spice and floral-inflected red currant aromas give way to cool, intense and once again beautifully well-detailed flavors that possess better volume if not refinement, all wrapped in a more complex and notably more structured finale. This is delicious and should be approachable after only 5-ish years of keeping.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 91-93	<p>A blend of three Premier Crus (20% Les Cras, 20% Les Murgers and 60% Les Richemone), the 2017 Nuits Saint-Georges Les Murgers des Cras has a perfumed nose of precocious red berry fruit, baking powder and orange zest aromas. The smooth, harmonious palate is fleshy and generous, displaying more cohesion and sensuality than some of the other Village Crus. Burghound Score: 89-91	<p>An exuberantly fresh nose combines notes of various red berries, earth and soft floral nuances. There is both energy and refinement to the overtly mineral-inflected flavors thanks to the relatively fine-grained tannins shaping the refreshing finish that is wrapped around a core of bright acidity. Lovely.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 87-89	<p>The 2017 Morey-Saint-Denis en la Rue de Vergy has a perfumed, floral bouquet of red cherries, orange zest and fig-like scents. The palate is medium-bodied with supple tannin, smooth, silky texture and commendable purity on the charming finish, which perhaps just lacks a little substance. Burghound Score: 90-92	<p>A relatively high-toned, airy and cool nose features notes of pomegranate, red cherry, violets and a touch of the savage. The delicious and pure middle weight flavors display excellent delineation on the focused, notably firm and moderately austere finish that offers very fine length. There is a hint of rusticity but overall this is finer than it usually is.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 90-92	<p>The 2017 Morey-Saint-Denis La Riotte 1er Cru offers lucid red cherry, crushed strawberry and blood orange on the nose, coming across quite vibrant and almost Chambolle-like in style. Burghound Score: 90-93	<p>There is just enough reduction present to blur the nuance on the nose of spicy and floral-inflected dark cherry aromas. More interesting are the once again ultra-sleek, intense and beautifully precise medium weight flavors that are so mineral-driven that they're like rolling small pebbles around in the mouth, all wrapped in a clean, youthfully austere and linear finish. This is presently very tightly wound and will need bottle age to soften the firm tannins and add flesh to the finish. In short, this is classy but in no mood to come out and play.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 91-93	<p>The 2017 Vosne-Romanée Les Beaux Monts Vieilles Vignes 1er Cru has a very attractive, expressive bouquet of quite precocious macerated red cherries, kirsch, orange sorbet and hints of <i>crème de cassis</i>, a little showy but irresistible. The silky-smooth palate is medium-bodied with fine tannin, more understated than the aromatics, and the finish is very cohesive and charming. Maybe it would benefit from more length, but it feels very natural and refined at the moment.</p> <p><i>Neal Martin</i></p>

Burghound Score: 91-94	<p>Here the densely fruited nose is a bit less floral but even spicier with its cool array of red currant, cherry, spice and earth-scented aromas. There is a bit more concentration and power to the attractively textured medium weight plus flavors thanks to the abundant amount of sappy dry extract that also serves to buffer the superbly long and highly complex finale. While these two wines are qualitatively similar, there is just a bit more depth of material that may ultimately make for a more complete wine.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 91-93	<p>The 2017 Nuits Saint-Georges La Richemone Vieilles Vignes 1er Cru comes from vines the oldest of which were planted in 1902. It has a generous bouquet, more Vosne-like than Nuits Saint-Georges, with kirsch, touches of blood orange and even Japanese <i>yuzu</i>. The palate is medium-bodied with silky tannin and finely judged acidity. The oak shows a little toward the finish, but that will be absorbed with time. Chambolle Musigny 1er Cru "La Combe d'Orveau Vieilles Vignes Ultra" (<i>On Allocation</i>)		91-93	90-92	\$450		
Burghound Score: 91-93	<p>A broadly floral-inflected nose combines notes of lavender, rose petal and lilac with those of both red and dark currant, anise, sandalwood and tea. There is slightly better density to the powerful yet caressing medium-bodied flavors that are less mineral-driven but even more complex and persistent on the overtly saline finish. This is a really lovely effort and worth your interest.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 90-92	<p>The 2017 Chambolle-Musigny La Combe d'Orveau "Cuvée Ultra," which comes from 80-year-old vines, was showing a bit more wood on the nose compared to the other cuvées on the day of my visit. The well-balanced palate features raspberry, allspice, cola and light crushed stone notes, silky-smooth texture and gentle grip on the finish. This actually improves in the glass, gaining more depth and harmony. Good potential here for when this is bottled.</p> <p><i>Neal Martin</i></p>

Burghound Score: 91-94	<p>Reduction has the upper hand over the fruit today. Otherwise there is once again excellent size, weight and power to the well-delineated and solidly stony flavors that possess both lovely balance and persistence if not quite the same level of complexity as the Chapelle though at this early stage, that isn't necessarily the way things will eventually wind up for this slightly more structured wine. Either way, both are lovely efforts.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 91-93	<p>The 2017 Mazoyères-Chambertin Vieilles Vignes Grand Cru feels a little tight on the nose at the moment, lacking the precision and terroir expression of the Charmes-Chambertin. Scents of blood orange mix with brown spices, and a little leather emerges with continued aeration. The palate is medium-bodied with fine, supple, quite saturated tannin. This feels nicely balanced, just a little oak showing through on the finish at the moment, but that will be assimilated.</p> <p><i>Neal Martin</i></p>					
Charmes Chambertin "Du Dessus Vieilles Vignes" (<i>On Allocation</i>)		91-94	92-94	\$520		
Burghound Score: 91-94	<p>A cool and beautifully pure if somewhat reticent nose grudgingly offers up a ripe and fresh array of dark berry, cherry, raspberry, spice, forest floor and a floral top note. There is excellent drive to the sizeable medium weight flavors that flash focused power on the wonderfully refreshing finish that is presently compact and very tightly wound. Patience.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 92-94	<p>Entrancing, pure wild strawberry and cranberry bouquet laced with allspice and orange pith. The oak here is nicely assimilated. The palate is very harmonious on the entry, with sorbet-like red fruit. Hints of salted licorice and Moroccan spices render the finish quite complex. A very fine Charmes-Chambertin that should age with style.</p> <p><i>Neal Martin</i></p>					
Chapelle-Chambertin Grand Cru (<i>On Allocation</i>)		92-94	92-94	\$520		
Burghound Score: 92-94	<p>This is more restrained still though aggressive swirling eventually coaxes the gorgeously broad-ranging and pure nose to reveal a more floral and spicier mélange of red and dark currant, plum, tea, and soft earth scents. The equally pure, naturally sweet, precise and beautifully detailed medium-bodied flavors possess slightly better depth and even a bit more persistence. In short, this is gorgeous and very Chapelle.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 92-94	<p>The 2017 Chapelle-Chambertin Grand Cru is much more reserved on the nose compared to the Charmes-Chambertin, the fruit a little darker. There is something of a crushed-pebble, almost beach-like scent, a distant tang of cockle sheds that surfaces with aeration. The palate is medium-bodied with fine-grained tannin and a little more depth and grip than the Charmes-Chambertin, even if it does not quite display the same sensuality and flesh on the finish. Burghound Score: 92-95	<p>This too is aromatically very cool and pure and there is plenty of nuance on the liqueur-like aromas of plum, dark cherry, forest floor and a suggestion of humus. The tight, focused and strikingly intense big-bodied flavors possess excellent mid-palate density along with a superbly long finish that, like the Beaux Monts, is akin to rolling small pebbles around in the mouth. This austere, backward and tightly coiled effort will need at least 6 to 8 years to add flesh and complexity and will likely require fully 20 years to reveal its full potential.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 94-96	<p>The 2017 Chambertin Grand Cru has the most backward and surly nose of Christophe Perrot-Minot's Grand Crus, but it just needs a few swirls to reveal enticing raspberry, cranberry, brown spice and slightly ferrous aromas. The <i>mineralité</i> starts to reveal itself with aeration. The medium-bodied palate offers supple tannin, gorgeous pure raspberry preserves notes mixed with blood orange, sea salt and light quince, and marmalade notes toward the succinct finish. Burghound Score: 92-95	<p>Both upper and lower register aromas include the essence of plum, red cherry and lavender that contrasts with plenty of spice, earth and savage elements. The rich, powerful and gorgeously textured flavors possess excellent size and weight along with very solid concentration where the abundant amount of dry extract buffers the very firm tannic spine shaping the youthfully austere and impressively long finish where a touch of bitter cherry pit character arises. Once again, patience definitely advised.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 92-94	<p>The 2017 Chambertin Clos-de-Bèze Grand Cru has a clean, precise bouquet that is focused and direct, offering red and black fruit, crushed stone and more terroir expression than the Mazoyères. The palate is medium-bodied, the sappy red fruit on the entry laced with marmalade and dried quince, and grippy in the mouth, with a touch of spiciness, although it does not fan out on the finish as I hoped. Burghound Score: 90-92	<p>Here there is no reductive funk, indeed the nose is really quite elegant with its assortment of red cherry, raspberry, lavender, violet and soft spice wisps. There is slightly better mid-palate volume to the equally caressing medium weight flavors that offer a bit more overall depth and persistence on the dusty and well-balanced if more evidently structured finish that exudes a hint of bitter cherry pit character.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Chambolle Musigny 1er Cru "Les Amoureuses" (<i>On Allocation</i>)		91-94	-	\$378		
Burghound Score: 91-94	<p>The beautifully layered nose offers another small step up in elegance and a large step up in aromatic complexity and spiciness to the essence of red pinot fruit and intense floral influence. The intense yet refined and lacy middle weight flavors brim with minerality while remaining classy and gracefully largely thanks to the very finely grained tannins shaping the saline, complex and sneaky long finish. This is firm yet harmonious; indeed the word Zen comes to mind.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>

Burghound Score: 91-93	<p>A background hint of wood easily allows the cool and equally pure essence of red currant, plum and violet scents to be appreciated. There is a lovely sense of underlying tension to the tautly muscular flavors that are also shaped by relatively fine-grained tannins on the balanced and lingering finale. This is a Bonnes Mares of refinement and finesse that should age well on a base of balance.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>

Burghound Score: 88-90	<p>An exuberantly expressive nose jumps from the glass to reveal a lovely array of earth, red currant, spice and a whiff of lavender. There is once again an appealing sense of energy to the lighter weight flavors that deliver solid punch and persistence on the balanced finish. This is a relatively elegant Nuits villages.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 89-91	<p>The 2017 Nuits Saint-Georges Village is a blend of several vineyards that offer homogeneous ripeness but on different soils. It has quite an earthy, <i>sous-bois</i> tinged bouquet that is very well defined, the 60% whole bunches nicely integrated. The palate is medium-bodied with a tart opening, and the 10% new oak lends discreet lift toward a persistent finish spiced with a dash of black pepper. Excellent.</p> <p><i>Neal Martin</i></p>					
Nuits-Saint-Georges Les Poisets		88-91	88-90	\$75		
Burghound Score: 88-91	<p>This is the first wine to display any appreciable reduction though it's not so pungent as to mask the floral elements. The supple yet attractively vibrant middle weight flavors are delicious and complex though not as concentrated as the Vosne, all wrapped in a harmonious and refreshing finale. This is really quite pretty and should be enjoyable young.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 88-90	<p>The 2017 Nuits Saint-Georges Les Poisets has quite a rich bouquet compared to the other crus from Arnoux-Lachaux, offering bilberry and raspberry aromas and just a touch of iris. The stocky palate displays a firm backbone and plenty of <i>sous-bois</i>, here mixed with tobacco and spice, though it pulls up a little short on the finish. Fine.</p> <p><i>Neal Martin</i></p>

Burghound Score: 89-91	<p>Aromatically the nose possesses a similar fruit profile but it's notably spicier. There is also a bit more concentration to the medium-bodied flavors that possess a more refined mouthfeel before terminating in a saline and lingering finish. The refinement is mostly due to the dense but fine tannins and this should age well for its level.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 88-90	<p>Containing 70% whole bunches, the 2017 Vosne-Romanée Village is a blend of Les Communes, Les Saules and Bossières. It has a very floral bouquet, with wilted rose petals infusing the brambly red fruit, and hints of lavender tucked in just beneath. The medium-bodied palate is strict and linear, offering quite firm tannin and perhaps just requiring a little more finesse toward the finish at the moment. A fine but firm Chambolle villages.</p> <p><i>Allen Meadows</i></p>					
Vinous Score: 90-92	<p>The 2017 Chambolle-Musigny Village comes from north-facing vineyards toward the upper slopes – the last vines to ripen, as they can lie in the shade. Containing 80% whole bunch fruit, it has a well-defined, slightly tertiary bouquet with touches of black pepper and pencil lead. The medium-bodied palate presents fresh red fruit, lightly spiced with white pepper, sage and a touch of tobacco, perhaps a little Morey-like in structure, but with a very long finish. Vosne-Romanée "Les Hautes Maizières"		89-91	90-92	\$89		
Burghound Score: 89-91	<p>An expressly floral-infused nose offers up additional notes of spiced red raspberry and cherry scents. The sleek, intense and beautifully textured flavors instantly firm up on the robust and driving finish. This sappy effort should drink well young but also be capable of rewarding mid-term cellaring. Vinous Score: 90-92	<p>The 2017 Vosne-Romanée Les Hautes Maizières, from vines that more or less back onto the walls of Clos Vougeot, contains 80% whole bunches. The harmonious bouquet of red currant and cranberry fruit reveals touches of crushed stone and forest floor. The palate is very well balanced with fine tannin, a perfect line of acidity and beautiful focus, plus a tang of spice toward the structured finish. Superb.</p> <p><i>Neal Martin</i></p>

Burghound Score: 89-92	<p>This too is overtly floral though with more earth and less spice elements to the mostly red currant suffused nose. The juicy, even succulent medium weight flavors exhibit focused power and drive that carries over to the impressively complex and persistent finish. Vinous Score: 89-91	<p>The 2017 Nuits Saint-Georges Les Procès, which includes 50% whole bunches, has a very feminine, pure red cherry and crushed strawberry bouquet that develops flinty scents with aeration. The medium-bodied palate displays supple tannin and a fine bead of acidity and feels quite compact toward the finish; it will benefit from two or three years in bottle. Burghound Score: 90-92	A cool, pure and restrained nose grudgingly offers up pretty aromas of red currant, earth, lavender and a hint of the savage. There is excellent underlying tension to the delicious and well-detailed medium weight flavors that flash moderate rusticity on the firm, serious and mildly austere finish. This will definitely require at least a modicum of patience. <i>Allen Meadows</i>					
Vinous Score: 91-93	The 2017 Nuits Saint-Georges Les Corvées Pagets 1er Cru is 100% whole bunches.
